UNDERSTANDING THE WORLD

Science -

Rec – Animals: our pets and familiar animals.

KS1 - Animals, including humans: identify and name variety of common animals including fish, amphibians, reptiles, birds and mammals. Identify animals that are carnivores, herbivores and omnivores. Describe and compare structure of common animals.

Year 3/4 - Light: light is reflected, sun can be dangerous, shadows. Sound: vibrations, pitch, volume, distance.

Year 5/6 - Describe movement of the Earth and other planets relative to the Sun, use the Earth’s rotation to explain day and night. Light: light travels in straight lines, light travels from light sources to our eyes or from light sources to objects and then to our eyes, why shadows have the same shape as the objects that cast them. Gravity.

Geography -

Rec – Where do I live?

KS1 - Use simple compass directions and locational and directional language. Name and locate the 7 continents and 5 oceans. Use world maps, atlases and globes to identify UK countries. Four countries and capital cities of UK and surrounding seas.

Year 3/4 - Locate World’s countries - Europe. Maps.

Year 5/6 - North and South America. Maps.

History -

Rec – Exploration.

KS1 - Significant individuals from the past: Explorers.

Year 3/4 - Ancient Greece.

Year 5/6 - Crime and Punishment

RE - Harvest. Christmas Story.

Rec – Special People and Incarnation.

KS1 – Creation and Incarnation.

Year 3/4 – Hinduism: Divali and Christianity: Incarnation.
