Sports Premium Funding: September 2015 - August 2016

In April 2013 the Department for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport announced new funding to support the delivery of PE and school sport. Funding is being allocated to all state-maintained Secondary, Primary, Middle and Special Schools (including non-maintained Special Schools), Academies and Pupil Referral Units with primary aged pupils. This funding has been extended into the academic year 2015-16, although as of yet schools have not been notified of the amount of funding other than through the statement on the DfE website that states that it will be similar to the previous year (i.e. £8000 + £5 per pupil in Years 1-6 based on January 2015 census).

A number of measures in school have been implemented already and will continue to be implemented throughout the academic year. This funding has been provided to help improve learning in PE for **all** children; enhance the current high quality lessons that the school already delivers as well as introducing additional opportunities in the form of new sports, clubs and competitions.

This will impact on our children gaining new skills, confidence and experiences and our teachers learning new techniques and knowledge to aid them in teaching sport and PE. We strongly believe that our commitment to sport has a profound benefit on the academic achievements of our pupils.

This year we are using our Sport Premium to improve the quality of PE and Sport provision in the following ways:

Sports Premium Funding: September 2014 - August 2015

In the last academic year we used the Sports Premium Funding in the following ways:

- Providing professional development for staff in Dance and purchasing a new dance scheme to support staff in the delivery and assessment of Dance - (£400)
- Supporting regular Sports tournaments, festivals and competitions for pupils by funding transport and staffing costs (KS1 multi-skills festival, Kenway cup and West Dorset Football tournaments, Year 5 Festival, Tri-Golf tournament, Hi-five netball tournament) - (£1000)
- Hiring professional Sports coaches to teach the children different sports during curriculum time (Cricket coach, Gymnastics coach, Swimming teachers) - (£900)
- Investing, as part of the cluster of Primary Schools, in the employment of a Sports co-ordinator who is linked to the Secondary School - (£900)
- Paying for transport and access to indoor leisure facilities for weekly PE lessons for KS2 at the local leisure centre - (£3920)
- Purchasing of teaching resources of a non-traditional activity (circus skills) - (£300)
- Subsidising after school clubs to ensure breadth and balance - (£150)
- Developing Young Leaders in upper KS2 to promote activity and sport across the school - Bronze Sports Ambassadors and Playground Leaders - (£200)
- Purchasing additional resources and CPD for playground games to promote active learning and team games during lunchtimes - (£700)
- Organising and cover for intra-school competitions - (£500)
- Skip Hop Workshop and organisation of Skip Hop Talent Show - (£500)

Review of Provision and Impact:

- A member of staff attended Dance CPD and the additional resource was purchased. This has been used effectively across Key Stage 2 to enhance the delivery of Dance

- The school took part in a number of local sporting events organised by the Pyramid Sports Leader. This has given our pupils a variety of opportunities to take part in competitive sports
- Pupils have benefitted greatly from expert tuition from qualified teaching instructions. The vast majority of pupils leave Year 6 as competent swimmers
- Pupils benefit from using the Gymnastic equipment at the Leisure centre and being taught by a qualified Gymnastics teacher. Because of this input some pupils are inspired to join Gymnastic clubs after school to develop their skills further
- Pupils enjoyed taking part in a non-traditional sport (circus skills). There was no opportunity to develop this further within the local area
- The development of Bronze Sports Ambassadors has had the biggest impact on Sport within the school this year. The Ambassadors successfully organised a sponsored event, which raised £800 for the school. They also introduced a new KS2 Sports Day and initiated a whole school Beach Team Sports Challenge. The impact was monitored by the Link Governor and reported at FGB meetings
- The Ambassadors also led a Skip Hop Talent Show and were pro-active in encouraging younger pupils in participating in skipping during playtimes
- The school has achieved a Silver School Games Kitemark this year which reflects our commitment to competition. This has built on the Bronze Kitemark that the school achieved in the previous two year
