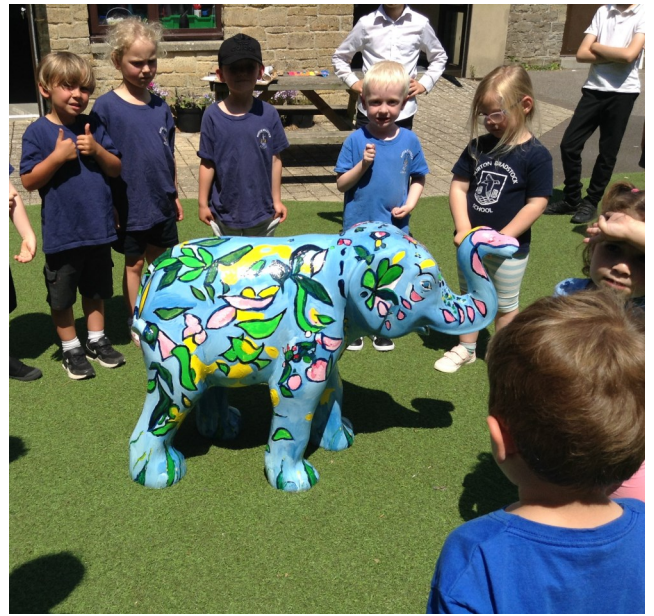
# Sport Day!

**Y5s** learnt about weaponry that was developed and used in WWII and how this impacted on how WWII was fought differently to WWI.

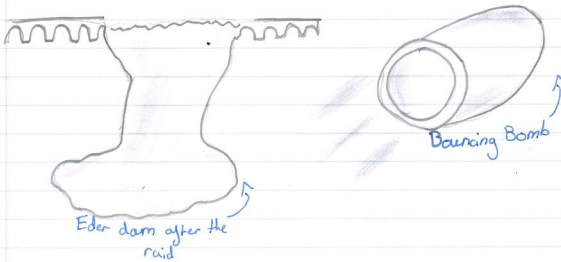

### Weaponry in WW2 (His)

- Tanks and Battle ships were adopted for WW2
- Engineers upgraded weapons while WW2 was happening
- Atomic bombs were the most advanced in WW2

### Bouncing bomb

The bouncing bomb was developed by a British engineer, Barnes Wallis in 1943-1942. Britain wanted to get rid of dams in the industrial area of Ruhr valley in Germany at the start of the war because they believed that if they had flooded the area, it would interrupt German weapon production. But, anti-aircraft guns made it hard to bomb the dams and underwater torpedoes would be caught by nets.



### Aircraft

The Supermarine Spitfire was a very manoeuvrable plane that was made by Reginald Mitchell in 1936. It had an advanced frame which made it durable. It was easy to control and had machine guns inside its wings to shoot enemy planes. These features gave the British a chance over the Luftwaffe's Messerschmitt Bf 109 during the Battle of Britain. Its design continuously improved during the war.

### WW2 Weaponry (His)

### Bouncing bomb



The bouncing bomb was an idea from Barnes Wallis in 1942, it was created to destroy dams in Ruhr Valley in Germany. They believed flooding the area will disturb weapon production. However, the German anti-aircraft guns made it hard so Barnes Wallis came up with the bouncing bomb which was designed to skip across the surface of the dam like a stone, slide down the dam walls and explode underwater. On the night of the 16<sup>th</sup> of May the bouncing bombs attacked three dams in Germany Rhine, Eder and Sorpe dam.

### Aircraft



The supermarine spitfire (which is an aircraft) was as fast and manoeuvrable that was designed by Reginald Mitchell in 1936. It was made with a metal frame which made it light and strong. It was easy to

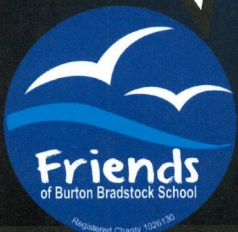
