The presentation about mummification to the rest of the school was fantastic!



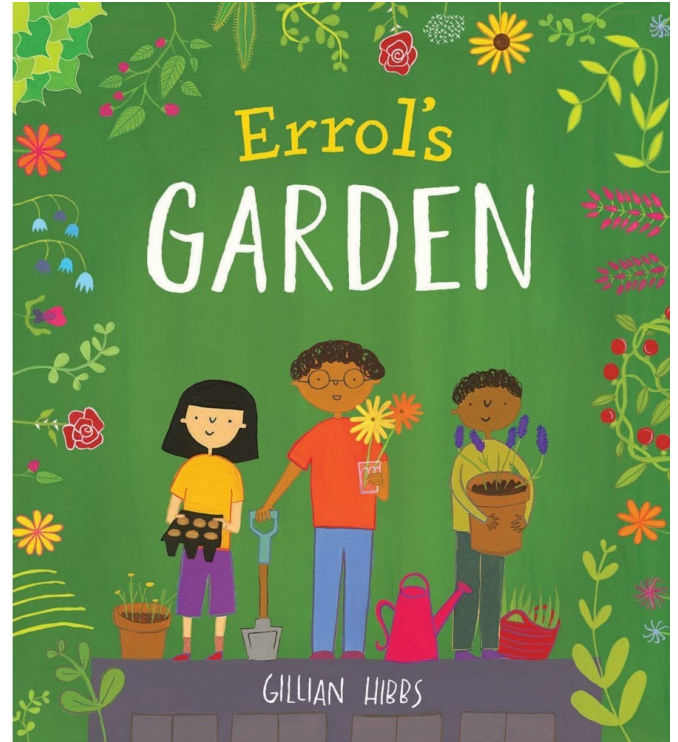

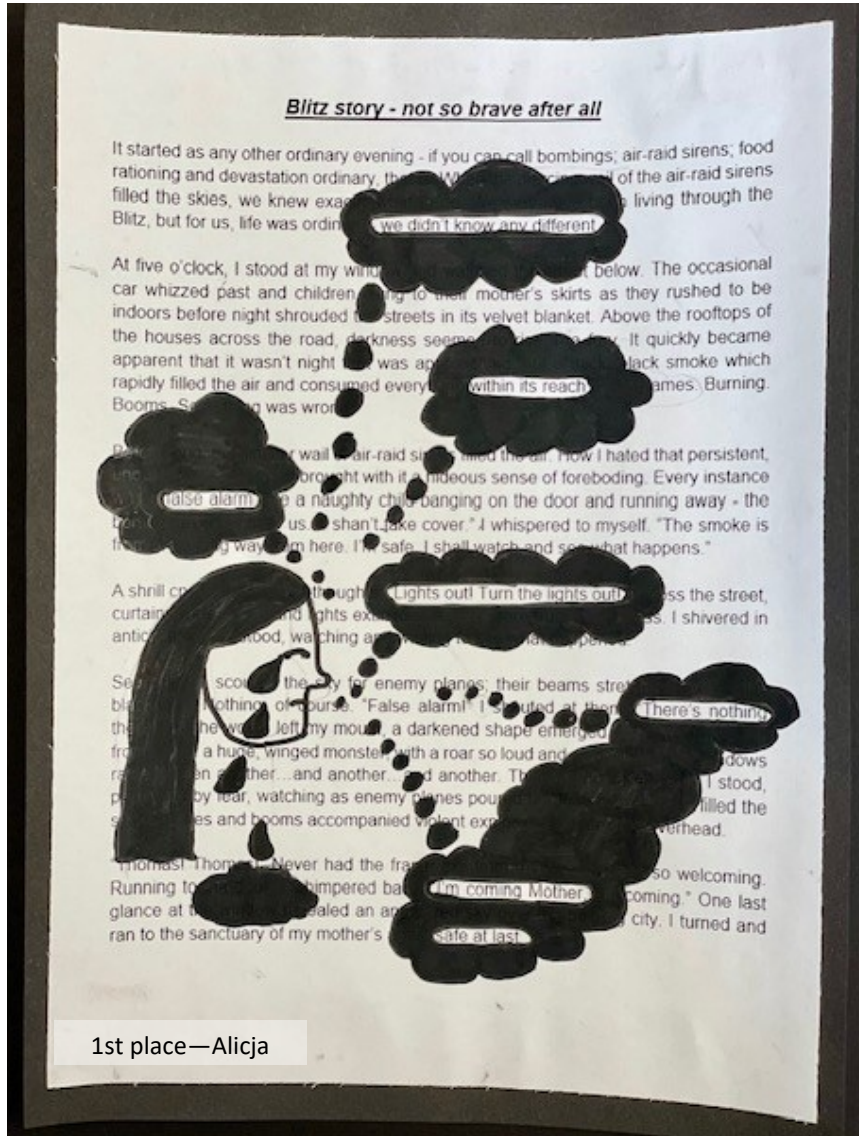


Hon mention—Chloe

Owls class created Blackout poetry inspired by the Blitz.

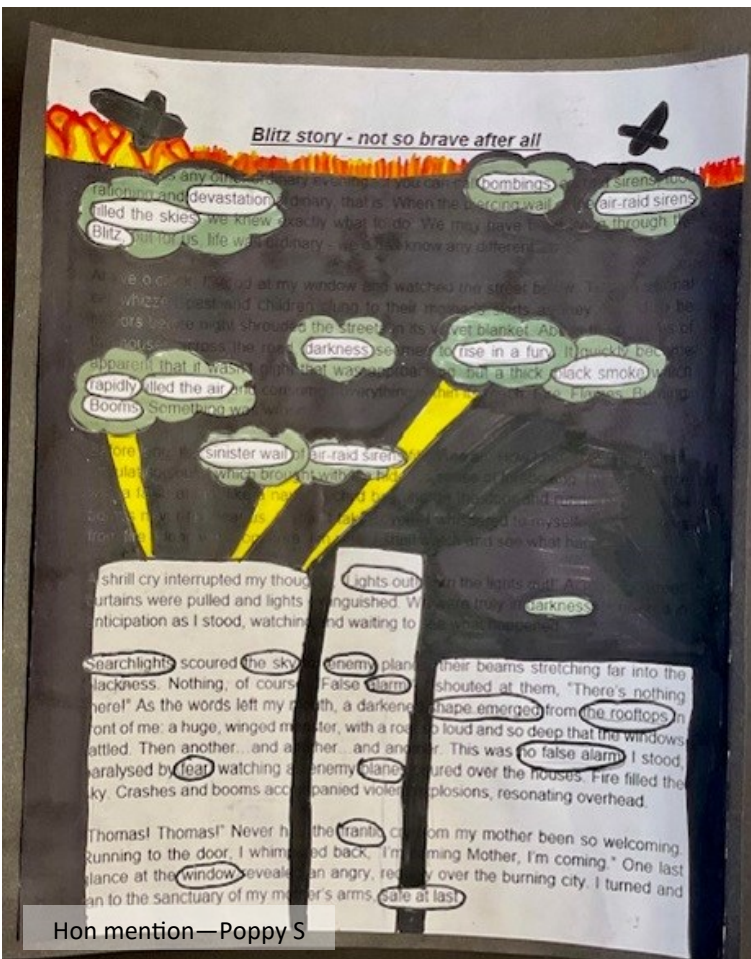
The children blacked out unwanted text to create unique poems from the now highlighted words or sentences.

# Pupil Premium is more than just Free School Meals

Next year we will offer the following for our children who receive Pupil Premium funding:

- £40 uniform voucher for Kitz UK
- Subsidised class trips and events (including KS2 swimming lessons)
- Free school dinners until Year 6
- 50% discount on Breakfast Club and Primary Forest after school club
- Subsidised music lessons



You may be eligible for pupil premium if you are receipt of certain welfare benefits. If you think you may be eligible [please apply for Free School Meals via Dorset Council](#).

**Even if your child is in Reception, Year 1 or Year 2 and is receiving government funded meals you should still apply for free school meals so that your child can receive PP funding.**
