Cross Country

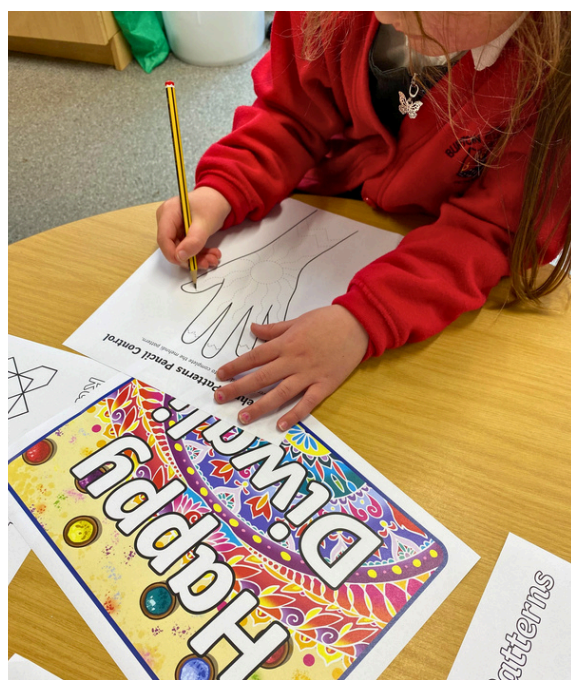

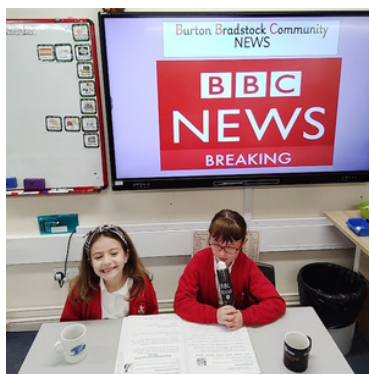
