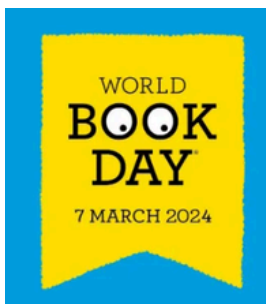

Our Stay and Play club runs every evening after school from 3:30 - 5:30pm and children take part in a range of different activities, snacks and fruit are available.

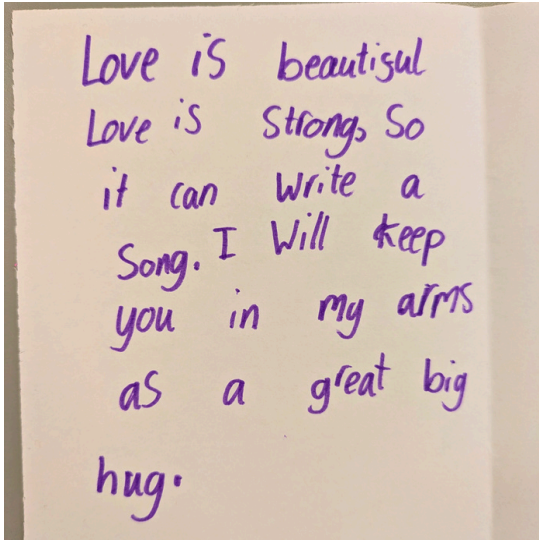
BOOK ON ARBOR!

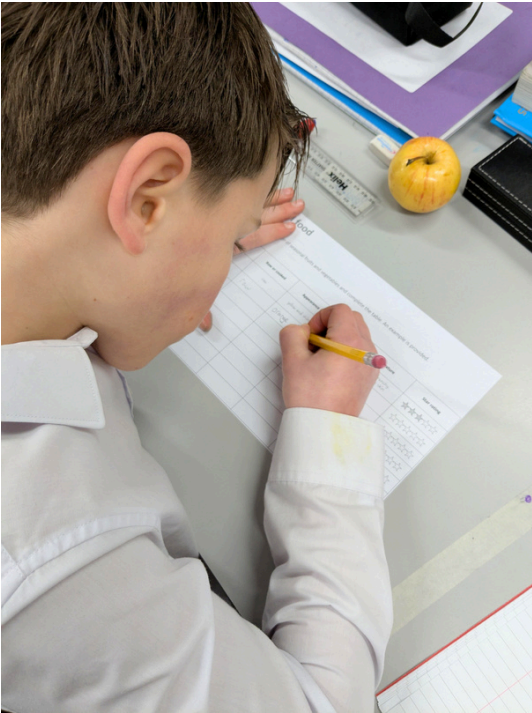
Robin class wrote Valentine's poems
