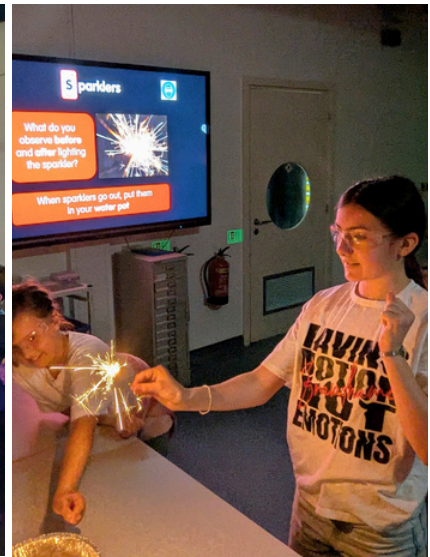
AROUND THE SCHOOL...
