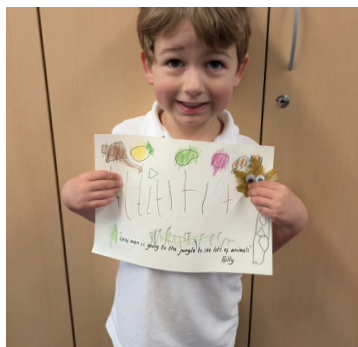
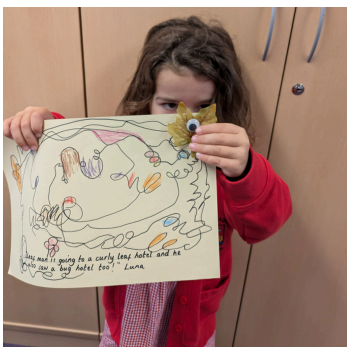
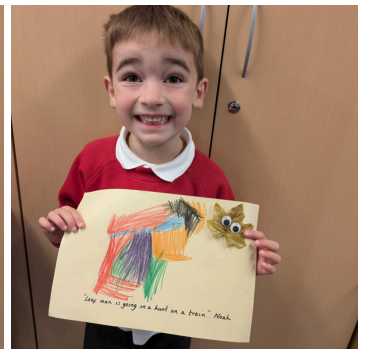
Around our School

At outdoor education this week the Nest found and created their own leaf man using real leaves in a variety of colours and sizes.

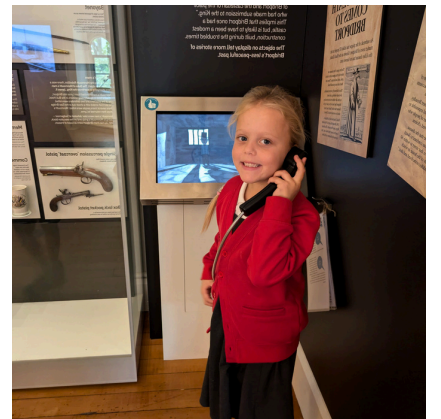
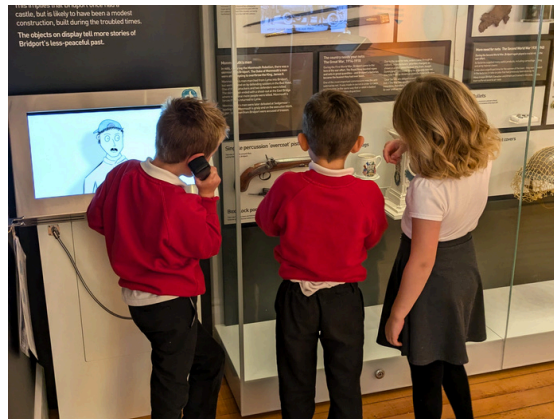
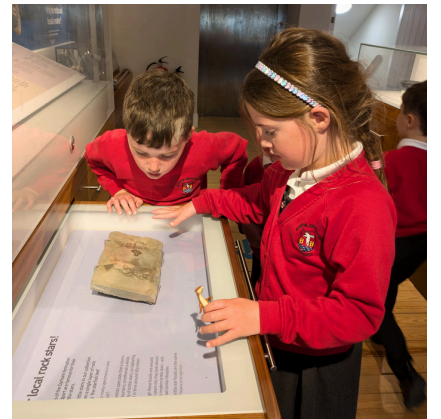


Whilst Robins learnt the difference between a den and a shelter.



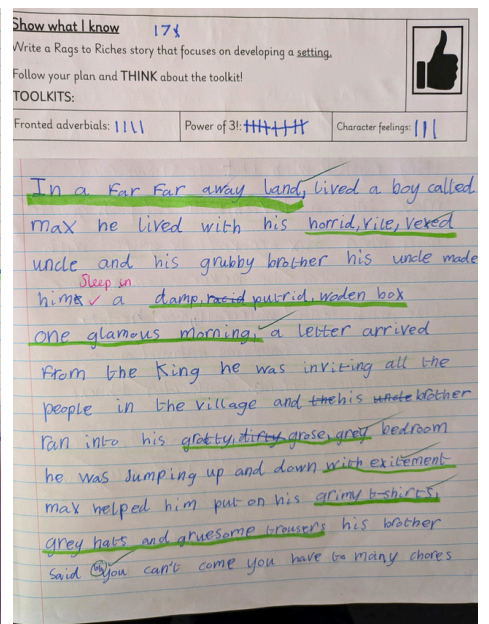
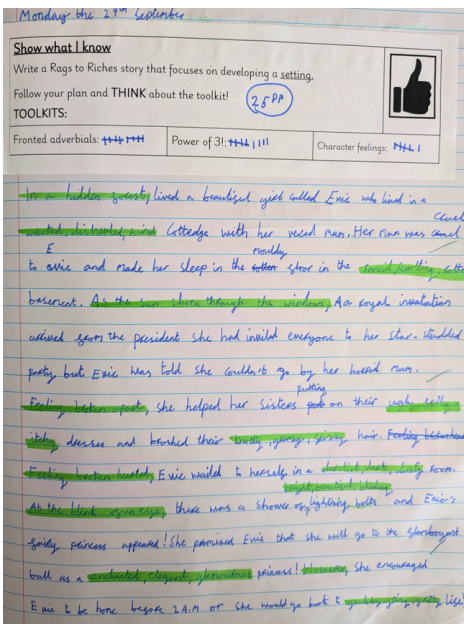
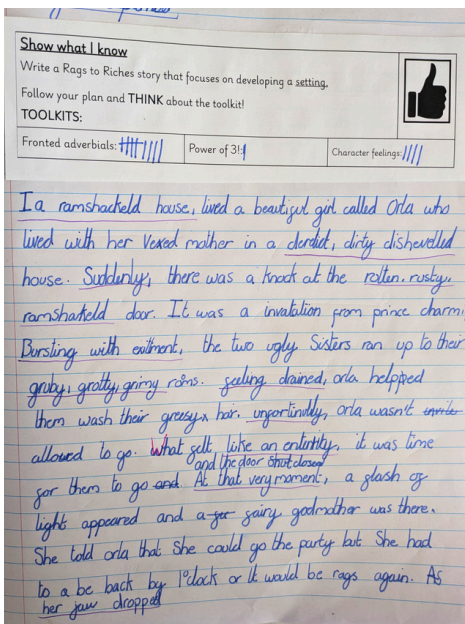
